

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This Educational Services and Transfer Agreement (“Agreement”) is made on this 21st day of July, 2023 by and between Hussian College (“Closed School”), located at 1500 Spring Garden Street, Philadelphia, PA and American Musical and Dramatic Academy d/b/a AMDA College of Performing Arts (“Teach-Out Provider”), located at 6305 Yucca St., Los Angeles, CA (collectively “the Parties” and individually “the relative Party”, “each Party”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Closed School is a postsecondary institution accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (“ACCSC”), approved by the California Department of Consumer Affairs, Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (“State Agency”), participating in the Title IV federal student aid programs administered by the U.S. Department of Education (“USDE”) under OPE ID #ED00746900, and offering baccalaureate degrees of fine arts in Commercial Dance, Film and Digital Content, Acting and Musical Theater (collectively, the “Teach-Out Programs”) at its Los Angeles campus located at 1201 West 5th Street, Los Angeles, CA (“Teach-Out Campus”).

WHEREAS, Teach-Out Provider, a postsecondary institution accredited by the WASC Senior Colleges and Universities Commission (“WSCUC”) and approved by the State Agency, also offers programs of study in performing arts, holds Title IV eligibility under OPE ID #ED00757200 and is in good standing with the U.S. Department of Education (“USDE”), is willing to enter into this Agreement to provide course transfer and educational services, on the terms and conditions hereafter provided;

WHEREAS, Closed School has voluntarily withdrawn and/or is no longer participating as a approved, accredited and/or participating institution with ACCSC, State Agency and the U.S. Department of Education necessary to support the students in Teach-Out Programs prior to the scheduled Fall term;

WHEREAS, due to the cessation of approvals, accreditation and participation necessary to continue the education of students in Teach-Out Programs, such students will not to be able to complete their educational programs at Closed School;

WHEREAS, the Closed School and the Teach-Out Provider are unaffiliated institutions with no shared ownership; and

WHEREAS, Teach-Out Provider and Closed School agree that it is in the best interest of the students of the Closed School for the Teach-Out Provider and the Closed School to enter into this Agreement and for the Teach-Out Provider to ensure access to comparable instruction and completion of studies of the existing Closed School students listed on Appendix A hereto (the “Students”) to the extent such Students pursue completion of their education with Teach-Out Provider, and to encourage all of the Students to transfer completed credits to Teach-Out Provider programs, and successfully complete their programs of study;

WHEREAS, after this Agreement is approved by all regulatory bodies holding regulatory jurisdiction over Teach-Out Provider and Closed School, Closed School will cease to provide instruction and Teach-Out Provider will process student transfers and begin to teach-out the Students and ensure continuing services for the Students; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree as follows with respect to the Students.

I. DESCRIPTION OF CONDITIONS AND SERVICES.

A. Teach-Out Provider specifically agrees and attests to the following:

1. To offer each of the Students, the opportunity to transfer all applicable credits from their current program with Closed School into an educational program that is of comparable quality and reasonably similar in content, structure, and scheduling to that provided by the Closed School, and each of the Students will be provided a reasonable opportunity to promptly resume and complete the course of study at the Teach-Out Campus;
2. To provide notice in a timely manner to Closed School necessary information regarding its programs, facilities, faculty, equipment, services, policies and practices, the manner and means of accomplishing the teach-out, and effectively advertise the availability of a teach-out to allow Closed School to notify students of the teach-out opportunity;
3. Will provide for the equitable treatment of Students, it has or can acquire and provide the necessary experience, resources and support services to provide an educational program that is comparable in content, structure, and scheduling to that provided by the Closed School, to remain stable, carry out its mission and meet all obligations to Students;
4. To provide the Students the instruction promised but not yet delivered by Closed School at the same program cost as originally agreed to, and with the same non-governmental scholarship and grant aid awarded to Students applied;
5. To provide student access to educational programs and services at a location in reasonable proximity to that location where Students planned to attend;
6. To provide the Students with information and sufficient advance notification about additional charges, if any, to transferability of credits or where a student wants to voluntarily transfer in to Teach-Out Provider and receive additional training for an additional cost;
7. To assure that the instruction and services offered to the Students, and the operations of the Teach-Out Provider meet WSCUC standards and to maintain necessary records documenting such performance;
8. That Teach-Out Provider is in good standing with the State Agency, WSCUC and DOE, as evidenced by Appendix B containing copies of its licenses, accreditation grant and Teach-Out Provider's current ECAR;
9. That Teach-Out Provider has sufficient administrative and financial capacity to deliver the Teach-Out Programs comparable in content, structure and scheduling to that provided by Teach-Out School;
10. That Teach-Out Provider, based on its strong financial condition as reflected in its FY 2020-2021 composite score of 2.1, has the capacity to remain stable, carry out its mission, and meet all obligations to the Students;

11. That Appendix C contains a list of all programs offered at the Closed School and the programs Students can transfer credits into, offered by Teach-Out Provider;
12. That the degree, diploma or certificate awarded to a Student upon successful completion of their program will be awarded by Teach-Out Provider;
13. That those Students who have already enrolled but have not yet started their course of study at Teach-Out School, and those Students who are on an approved leave of absence from the Teach-Out School, if any, with a return date that has not occurred, are entitled to participate in the Teach-Out under the terms herein;
14. That Teach-Out Provider will offer career services to Students that successfully complete their programs with Teach-Out Provider;
15. It has provided prior notice to its accrediting agency, and approval where necessary, prior to executing this Agreement;
16. That Teach-Out Provider will be the custodian of records for the Closed School Students in accordance with the requirements of all applicable federal and state laws and accrediting standards.
17. To follow the below transfer credit conditions:
 - a. Transfer credit for work completed at Closed School will be evaluated by Teach-Out Provider on an individual course-by-course basis and accepted as long as such courses have a grade of C or better and the course content is equivalent to the course it replaces in the new program;
 - b. Transfer credit for work completed at other postsecondary institutions will be evaluated by Teach-Out Provider on an individual course-by-course basis and accepted as long as such courses have a grade of C or better and the course content is equivalent to the course it replaces in the new program;
 - c. AP, CLEP or IB credit will be evaluated by Teach-Out Provider upon receipt of official scores from the testing agency and accepted as long as such scores meet Teach-Out Provider's minimum score requirements; and
 - d. Possible exceptions to residency requirements, course equivalencies and prerequisites will be granted on a case-by-case basis upon evaluation of Student records; and
18. That Teach-Out Provider will provide federal student aid assistance counseling and support for Students and families. Teach-Out Provider will comply with Title IV and other educational agency rules and regulations subsequent to the effective date of this Agreement, including determination of eligibility of the Students.

II. Closed School specifically agrees and attests to the following:

- A. That Closed School has provided a true and complete list of the names of the Students enrolled, with redacted social security numbers, listed by program and including the estimated graduation date for each (*see Appendix A*);
- B. Closed School has, and as practicable under the circumstances, will continue to provide notice to students regarding or relating to the availability of teach-out, closure, transferability of credits to Teach-Out Provider institution, or other pertinent information;
- C. Closed School will submit a completed Teach-Out Plan to its accreditor, ACCSC, and to USDE as and if required; and
- D.

E. That Closed School will provide Teach-Out Provider copies of the following records for the Students as outlined in I.A.19:

- Enrollment Agreements
- Financial Aid Transcripts
- Attendance Records

- Student Registration List
- Student Accounts

III. Closed School and Teach-Out Provider specifically agree and attest to the following:

1. That they individually and collectively have provided and will continue to provide appropriate notification about the Teach-Out to the accrediting and federal and state authorities as practicable under the circumstances.

2. REAL PROPERTY, EQUIPMENT AND CURRICULUM. In consideration of Teach-Out Provider's agreement to bear any costs of performing its obligations under this Agreement not covered by tuition payments which will be made by the Students and to provide Students continuity in their studies through the conclusion of the transfer process, the Closed School hereby: (i) grants to the Teach-Out Provider, at no cost and for the Teach-Out period and for the purpose of conducting the Teach-Out, (A) a license to use and consume supplies and inventory (textbooks, linens, etc.) currently existing at the Teach-Out Campus; and (B) a license to access learning resource center materials now existing at the Teach-Out Campus ("Teach-Out Campus Assets"); and (ii) agrees to provide such assistance as is reasonably possible to the Teach-Out Provider in negotiations with the landlord of the Teach-Out Campus for a lease for the period of 12 months. For avoidance of doubt, a purchase of real estate, campus equipment or other assets is not contemplated by this Agreement.

3. TERM. This Agreement may not be terminated by either party unless and until all Students affected by this Agreement have either completed their programs or ceased to be enrolled, and then can be terminated by either Party with written notice. Termination will not affect any monies owed under this Agreement.

4. CONFIDENTIALITY. The Parties, and their employees, agents, or representatives will not at any time or in any manner, either directly or indirectly, use for the personal benefit of the relative Party, or divulge, disclose, or communicate in any manner, any information that is proprietary to each Party. The Parties and their employees, agents, and representatives will protect such information and treat it as strictly confidential, except as where reasonably necessary to execute the terms of this Agreement. This provision will continue to be effective after the termination of this Agreement.

5. STATUS AND COMPLIANCE WITH LAW. Teach-Out Provider hereby represents that (i) it is appropriately licensed and in good standing with any applicable state or federal regulatory licensing agency; and (ii) it is not under investigation, subject to an action, or being prosecuted for an issue related to academic quality, misrepresentation, fraud, or other matters by a law

enforcement agency. Teach-Out Provider agrees that it shall perform its obligations under this Agreement in a manner that is in compliance with any and all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, including but not limited to relevant statutory and regulatory provisions under the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (20 U.S.C. § 1094(a)(20)), or any successor provision, and the regulations promulgated thereunder by the U.S. Department of Education, and the Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, and other applicable federal, state and local laws.

6. HOLD HARMLESS. Closed School agrees to hold Teach-Out Provider harmless from all claims, losses, expenses, fees including reasonable attorney fees, costs, and judgments that may be asserted against Teach-Out Provider that result from the acts or omissions of Closed School and/or its employees, agents, or representatives.

7. WARRANTY. Teach-Out Provider shall provide its services and meet its obligations under this Agreement in a timely and workmanlike manner, using knowledge and recommendations for performing the services which meet generally acceptable standards in Teach-Out Provider's community and region, and will provide a standard of care equal to, or superior to, care used by service providers similar to Teach-Out Provider on similar projects.

8. RECORDS. Teach-Out Provider agrees that it shall retain all records as outlined above in I.A.19 for the period of time required by Title IV regulations and for any longer period of time required by any other applicable laws.

9. DEFAULT. The failure to make available or deliver the Services as described herein will be considered an occurrence of material default under this Agreement. Either party has a cure period of three (3) business days prior to initiation of a Termination for breach.

10. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties, and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement whether oral or written concerning the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement supersedes any prior written or oral agreements between the parties.

11. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement will be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions will continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision will be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

12. AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be modified or amended in writing, if the writing is signed by the party obligated under the amendment. The parties agree that this Agreement must meet all requirements of applicable state and Federal laws. The parties further agree to cooperate as necessary to make all amendments to this Agreement appropriate to meet the requirements of state and Federal law.

13. GOVERNING LAW. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

14. NOTICE. Any notice or communication required or permitted under this Agreement shall be sufficiently given if delivered in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address set forth in the opening paragraph or to such other address as one party may have furnished to the other in writing.


15. WAIVER OF AGREEMENT CONTRACTUAL RIGHT. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Agreement.

16. REGULATORY REVIEW. The parties hereby acknowledge that, prior to their execution of this Agreement, the terms and provisions of this Agreement were reviewed and approved by the State Agency, ACCSC, WSCUC and USDE and that those agencies have given their approval of this Agreement. Should the parties hereafter mutually determine that there is a need to modify any of the provisions of this Agreement, they shall notify each of the foregoing agencies of such planned modification.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by their duly authorized representatives as of the date first above written.




